TRI-TOWNSHIP PUBLIC LIBRARY DISTRICT AUGUST 6, 1996 MINUTES OF BOARD MEETING

REGULAR MEETING called to order at 7:00 p.m.

<u>ROLL CALL</u> - Present were Huck, Madison, Murray, Noonan, Merz - (5). Absent - Abell, Cassot - (2).

OTHERS PRESENT - Gulley, B. Noonan, Van Hoose, Walker.

MINUTES - A motion was made by Noonan, seconded by Huck, to approve the minutes of the 7/2/96 board meeting. Motion passed. Ayes - Huck, Madison, Murray, Noonan, Merz - (5). Absent - Abell, Cassot - (2).

BILL LIST - (See copy).

A motion was made by Murray, seconded by Noonan, to approve the bill list as presented.

Motion passed. Ayes - Huck, Madison, Noonan, Murray, Merz (5). Absent - Abell, Cassot - (2).

Walker discussed the roof vents which froze during the month of February because the vent flue is not the correct size, according to France Mechanical. France contacted Montgomery Engineering while we were still under the construction contract. We have not heard anything in response to that letter. Noonan suggested that Walker send a letter to Montgomery Engineering, Ittner, and K&S, with a copy to France Mechanical, requesting that we receive a response from them within 30 days concerning this problem. At the end of that time Eastman will send a letter threatening legal action.
